POLICIES ON CONFLICT OF INTEREST, HUMAN AND ANIMAL RIGHTS, AND INFORMED CONSENT

Conflict of Interest Declaration

Declaration on the Conflicts of interest or sometimes referred as competing interests is mandatory to authors when submitting the manuscript to Tropical Biomedicine. All submitted manuscripts must include a "Conflict of Interests" section at the end of the manuscript listing all conflict of interest, for example, personal, financial, intellectual property, affiliation, and ideology. Where authors have no conflict of interests, the statement should read "The author declare that they have no conflict of interests." Editors and reviewers are also required to declare any conflict of interests and will be excluded from the peer review process if a competing interest exists.

Human and Animal Rights Statement

All research must have been carried out within an appropriate ethical framework which complies with the guidelines for human studies and animal welfare regulations. The submitted study must be supported by the ethics/bioethics committee approval and it should be stated in the manuscript, if relevant. Authors should state that subjects have given their informed consent; and should state that animal experiments conform to institutional standards.

Informed Consent

Tropical Biomedicine does not accept details (including patients' names, initials, hospital numbers and any other details) and images related to individual participants. Experimental research on vertebrates or any regulated invertebrates must comply with institutional, national, or international guidelines, and where available should have been approved by an appropriate ethics committee.
